

Regulations for Scholarships for Overseas and International Students at Kainan University

Passed at the 211th Administrative Meeting of the University on October 26, 2021.

Amended and passed at the 217th Administrative Meeting of the University on April 19, 2022, Articles 5 and 6.

Article 1: Kainan University (hereinafter referred to as "the University") establishes these regulations to reward and provide financial assistance to outstanding overseas Chinese students, Hong Kong and Macau students, and international students (hereinafter referred to as "overseas students") applying for admission to the University.

Article 2: Overseas students, as referred to in these regulations, are those who enter the University in accordance with the regulations of "Regulations for Overseas Chinese Students Returning to Taiwan for Study and Guidance," "Regulations for Hong Kong and Macau Residents Coming to Taiwan for Study," and "Regulations for Foreign Students Coming to Taiwan for Study."

Article 3: The award period for this scholarship is up to four years for undergraduate students and up to two years for master's degree students.

Article 4: The scholarship recipients and amounts are as follows:

I. New Student Entrance Scholarships:

(1) Undergraduate overseas students are eligible for a total exemption of tuition and miscellaneous fees for two semesters. The reduction method is as follows:

Transfer students receive tuition and miscellaneous fee discounts based on their enrolled grade level.

(2) Master's program overseas students are granted a one-semester full tuition and miscellaneous fee waiver for the first semester of their enrollment. It's a 50% reduction for the first semester, and another 50% reduction for the second semester.

Academic Scholarships:

(1) Undergraduate overseas students who rank first in their year by academic performance in the previous semester receive a scholarship of NT\$20,000, subject to approval by the International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee. If the top student in the department has graduated or dropped out, their ranking is not filled.

(2) Undergraduate overseas students who rank in the top 10% by academic performance in their year in the previous semester (rounded up), receive a scholarship of NT\$6,000, subject to approval by the International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee. If a student in the top 10% of academic performance has graduated or dropped out, their ranking is not filled.

(3) The Department of Applied Chinese Language may establish academic performance ranking criteria and provide the results to the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs (hereinafter referred to as "the Office") as the basis for awarding academic scholarships.

If there are other provisions in the agreement or memorandum of international exchange, those provisions will take precedence over the items for this scholarship.

Article 5: The application period for this scholarship is as follows:

New Student Entrance Scholarships:

(1) Applicants should submit their applications in conjunction with the registration deadlines for the university's fall or spring semesters when applying to the university.

(2) Students who continue to receive this scholarship during their enrollment do not need to reapply, as relevant information will be provided by the Office of Academic Affairs and the Office of Student Affairs.

Academic Scholarships: There is no separate application for this scholarship, and relevant information will be provided by the Office of Academic Affairs.

Article 6: The required documents for applying for this scholarship are as follows:

New Student Entrance Scholarships:

(1) Before admission, applicants should provide the necessary documents for applying to the university.

(2) Students who continue to receive this scholarship during their enrollment do not need to reapply, as relevant information will be provided by the Office of Academic Affairs and the Office of Student Affairs.

Academic Scholarships: There is no separate application for this scholarship, and relevant information will be provided by the Office of Academic Affairs.

Article 7: Recipients of New Student Entrance Scholarships are required to complete 72 hours of service learning, with 36 hours in each semester, during their first year of enrollment. Their service learning performance will be assessed at the end of the term and will serve as a reference for future renewals or applications. Specific regulations for service learning will be established separately.

Article 8: The scholarship eligibility of overseas students who receive scholarships from the second semester onwards will be canceled under the following circumstances:

(1) They fail to complete a minimum of 15 credits in the current semester.

(2) They have an average grade below 80 in the previous semester, or they fail in more than two subjects.

(3) Their behavioral grades are below 80 in the previous semester.

(4) They have a disciplinary record of minor offenses or more in the previous semester.

(5) They delay fee payment or owe any fees.

(6) They engage in illegal off-campus employment.

(7) They fail to pass the service learning certification.

(8) They take unauthorized leave or are absent for more than 4 weeks.

(9) They have withdrawn or dropped out of school.

Article 9: Those who receive scholarships under this regulation will undergo initial review by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs. After this, the list of recipients will be reviewed and approved by the International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee and published on the Office's website.

Article 10: Individuals who have already received scholarships of similar nature from the government of Taiwan or similar scholarships from the university in

the same academic year are not eligible to receive this scholarship.

Article 11: This regulation, approved by the International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee and the administrative meeting, takes effect from the date of publication. The same applies to any future amendments.
