

Regulations Regarding New Student Grant for International Students at Kainan University

- Article 1** The university hereby establishes the following regulations to provide rewards and subsidies to exceptional overseas Chinese, Hong Kong and Macao students, and foreign students (hereinafter collectively referred to as "overseas and foreign students") who seek admission to Kainan University.
- Article 2** For the purpose of these regulations, "overseas and foreign students" shall refer to those who have been accepted in accordance with the rules set forth in "Regulations Regarding Overseas Chinese Students Returning to Taiwan for Studies," "Regulations Regarding Hong Kong and Macao Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan," and "Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan."
- Article 3** The scholarship award periods for this program shall be four years for undergraduate students and two years for graduate students.
- Article 4** 1. The qualifications for applying for this scholarship and the subsidy amounts are as follows:
- I. Freshman Scholarship
 - i. Qualifications*
 - a. Overseas Chinese, Hong Kong, and Macao students: Refers to freshmen who are admitted through the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students or the independent enrollment program of Kainan University Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs.
 - b. International students: Refers to freshmen who are admitted through the independent enrollment program of Kainan University Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs.
 - ii. Subsidy Amount*
 - a. Undergraduate overseas and international student freshmen will receive a full tuition and miscellaneous fees waiver for a total of two semesters, and the reduction

method is as follows:

Transferred students will receive a tuition and miscellaneous fees reduction according to their year of enrollment.

II. Graduate overseas Chinese and international new students will receive a full tuition and miscellaneous fees waiver for a total of one semester. The reduction will be 50% for the first semester of the first year and the second semester will also be reduced by 50%.

2. Merit Scholarship

I. Qualifications and amount

i. Undergraduate overseas Chinese and international students who are ranked first in their year according to academic performance in the previous semester will receive a scholarship of NT20,000. The award will be granted after review by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee. If the first-ranked student has already taken a leave of absence or dropped out, the award will not be passed on.

ii. The university will award scholarships of NTD 6,000 to the top 10% of overseas Chinese and international students in their academic year based on their performance in the previous semester. The scholarship will be awarded unconditionally and will be issued upon approval by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee. Students who have dropped out or withdrawn from the top 10% of their academic year will not be replaced.

iii. The Department of Applied Chinese may establish academic performance ranking criteria and provide the results to the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs (hereinafter referred to as "the office") as the basis for issuing academic scholarships.

3. In the event that the agreements or memoranda of international exchange contain different provisions regarding the items covered by this scholarship, the relevant provisions of those agreements or memoranda shall prevail.

Article 5

The time for applying for this scholarship is as follows:

1. Freshman Scholarship

I. Applicants should submit their application before the enrollment deadline of the fall or spring semester in accordance with the school's enrollment policies.

II. Those who are renewing this scholarship during the academic year are exempt from re-applying, as the relevant information will be provided by the Academic Affairs

Office and the Student Affairs Office.

2. Merit Scholarship: This scholarship is exempt from application, as the relevant information will be provided by the Academic Affairs Office.

Article 6 The required information for applying for this scholarship is as follows:

1. Freshman Scholarship

I. Applicants should provide the required information for enrollment before entering the university.

II. Those who are renewing this scholarship during the academic year are exempt from re-applying, as the relevant information will be provided by the Academic Affairs Office and the Student Affairs Office.

2. Merit Scholarship: This scholarship is exempt from application, as the relevant information will be provided by the Academic Affairs Office.

Article 7 Those who receive the Freshman Scholarship can be guided by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs (hereinafter referred to as "the Office") to complete 72 hours of service learning, with 36 hours per semester, in the first year of enrollment. At the end of the semester, their service learning status will be assessed and used as a reference for future renewals or application reviews. The details of the service learning will be specified separately.

Article 8 For overseas Chinese and international students who receive scholarships from the second semester onwards, their scholarship eligibility will be canceled if any of the following situations occur:

I. Fail to achieve a minimum of 15 credits for the semester.

II. Academic average for the previous semester is less than or equal to 80 points, or they have failed in more than two courses.

III. Conduct score average for the previous semester is less than 80 points.

IV. Received a minor or higher disciplinary action during the previous semester.

V. Delayed or failed to pay any of their fees.

VI. Engaged in illegal off-campus employment.

VII. Do not passed the service learning certification.

VIII. Absent from class for more than 4 weeks without permission.

IX. Withdrawn or dropped out of the university.

Article 9 The list of scholarship recipients who have been approved by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee will be published on the website of the Office.

Article 10 Those who have received scholarships from other government agencies in our country or from the university for the same academic year are not eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Article 11 This policy has been passed by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs Committee and the administrative meeting, and is to be implemented from the date of publication. Any modifications made to this policy will follow the same procedure.
